Instructions and rules of behaviour during Sports Service activities

• Participant behaviour

The participant must comply with the ban on consuming alcoholic beverages and smoking during conducted activities.

The consumption of intoxicating substances is also forbidden at all times, even if not during the activities conducted.

Reporting misconduct

The instructor has the right to suspend the activity if a participant's behaviour endangers his/her own safety or that of the other participants. The person in question may only resume the activity after confirming that he or she abides by the rules of behaviour dictated by the instructor.

Should the misbehaviour continue, the instructor has the right to remove the person permanently.

Liability

The participant is obliged to report any physical dysfunctions or intake of medication. Those responsible for the individual disciplines may decide not to admit unfit persons to the activities.

For all activities, insurance cover is the responsibility of the individual participants.

The USI Sports Service accepts no liability in the event of:

- Accident of the participant
- Injury to third parties caused by the participant or the sports equipment he/she uses
- Damage caused to the material of the USI SUPSI Sport Service and of third parties, due to incorrect use of the same.

Only the participant is permitted to use the material.

Insurance

Participants are required to check the suitability of their insurance cover both in Switzerland and abroad. During all USI Sport Service activities it is compulsory to carry one's own insurance card or document.

We strongly recommend REGA patronage membership for 40 CHF/year.



Rules of conduct

Users of the Sports Service must behave in accordance with the principles of loyalty, fairness, respect and Fair Play in all sports activities and events, actively cooperating in the orderly and civilised coexistence.

The concept of Fair Play encompasses

- Friendship
- Respect for others
- Fighting cheating and violence

All users are obliged to respect the rules and regulations indicated by the person in charge of each activity. The various persons in charge have the right to remove participants who do not adopt the principle of good behaviour or who do not listen to the instructions given.
